As our country is at the peak of its development, it pays special attention to international relations. It should be noted that the program of the Strategy of Action for 2017-2021 of President Shavkat Mirziyoyev also includes a special principle of security, interethnic harmony and religious tolerance, a well-thought-out, mutually beneficial and practical foreign policy, strengthening the independence and sovereignty of our state, the formation of an environment of security, stability and good neighborliness around Uzbekistan, strengthening the international prestige of our country. By 2021, our president has been abroad 48 times.

These reforms, of course, will be carried out on the basis of certain criteria, based on certain decisions and laws, decrees. For example, the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers No. 616 of August 3, 2018 "On approval of the Regulation on the Department of Legal Expertise, International Agreements and Development of Foreign Relations of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan." "One of the tools of foreign policy is diplomacy," he said. Diplomacy - (French) - one of the ways to implement the foreign policy of the state. Diplomatic heads of state, government, foreign affairs agencies and direct diplomats take the form of official activities that help them achieve their foreign policy goals and objectives and protect the interests of their country and individual citizens abroad.

In other words, diplomacy is the goal of government in foreign policy and a means of implementing diplomacy through foreign policy. "The basic principles of international law, which are currently in force in international political relations, are reflected in the UN Charter of October 24, 1945. It establishes the rules of respect for state independence, peaceful coexistence, fulfillment of duties and responsibilities, peaceful settlement of disputes through political negotiations, nonuse of force, and non-interference in internal affairs. Given.

Today, the new system of international relations in Uzbekistan and the growing role of our country in the international rankings are, of course, the result of our reforms." In particular, over the past four years, the country's Heritage Fund's Economic Freedom Index has risen 52 places, and the World Bank's Logistics Efficiency. "Index rose by 19 points, and in the "Doing Business" index - by 18 points.

Uzbekistan has risen from a Group 6 country to a Group 5 country in the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development's Country Risk Classification system.
