### Neologisms in Modern Uzbek and Modern English Languages (On the Material of Mass Media Texts)

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**Annotation:** All the countries in the world are connected to each other. Through these connections, as in all areas, the vocabulary of both languages undergoes certain changes, that is, new words are introduced. Uzbek is spoken in the same way as in other countries. It is known that the Uzbek people have historically had economic, political and cultural ties with other nations. This has a certain effect on the language of the people with whom they communicate. As a result of the interaction, changes occur in all parts of the language: phonetics, vocabulary, grammar, etc., as well as in neologisms. The rate at which new words are introduced also depends on the period. In the past, Uzbek had a lot of words in Russian, but now there are more new words in English than in other languages.

#### INTRODUCTION

The granting of the status of the state language to the Uzbek language and the achievement of the will and freedom of the Uzbek people accelerated this process, and hundreds and thousands of neologisms appeared in our language. In particular, new terms have emerged in the banking sector, such as economics, banking and credit, and diplomacy. These include terms such as market economy, licensing, monitoring, receivable, quota, manager, management, gross debt, franc market<sup>1</sup>.

#### MATERIALS AND METHODS

Emerging words can be classified according to various aspects. First of all, they are called sociopolitical terms: minister, ministry, office, governor, district, agro-firm, farmer; economic terms: dealer, leasing, engineering, market infrastructure; scientific and technical terms: internet, computer, disk drive, scanner; lexical units related to school-education: academic lyceum, college, program, etc. can be divided into dozensof areas<sup>2</sup>. Among the neologisms of assimilation there are transient, hasty, artificially formed lexemes. For example: magazine, magazine, magazine, opener, writer, program, university. They were quickly rejected by the people. Most of the neologisms are assimilated in two different ways: 1) On the basis of internal possibilities (expansion of meaning, through the use of derivation): transparency, alternative, reconstruction, auction, governor, office. 2) At the expense of external opportunities (by word of mouth): modemogram, video equipment, matiz, kick boxing, karate, damas, tiko, nexia.

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#### RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Assimilation neologisms determine the level of expressive capacity of a language. During the years of independence, our lives have changed dramatically. New concepts have emerged. New concepts are more internal features of the language<sup>3</sup>:

- a) to speak in dialects;
- b) Is based on the use of word formation.

Sometimes words come from other languages in different ways.

These are derived words. Know that there is no language in the world that does not speak other languages. Just as the words struggle, side, half, and honest are entering all the languages of the world, our language is also enriched by derived words that represent a number of new concepts that have entered our lives.

It has long been known that 3 components play an important role in the formation of the Uzbek lexicon. These are:

- 1. All words are derived from the oldest Turkic language and play an important role in the development of Uzbek lexicon, in addition, everyday words and phrases are reflected in the above elements.
- 2. Assimilated words, such words come from other languages, such as Arabic, Persian-Tajik, Russian, German, French, Spanish, English and others. The interesting thing is that these words are mainly a combination of classical languages (Arabic, Turkish, Persian-Tajik).
- 3. Assimilation neologisms, words of this type are formed by adding suffixes, prefixes and suffixes to words that exist in the language.

In addition to the three components listed above, secondary elements also contribute to the development of vocabulary. These are:

- Onomatopoeia, the formation of one word from another;
- Abbreviated words, abbreviated names only in capital letters;
- The entry of foreign words into our language and their use leads to the emergence of certain new words in our language, and this group of words is called assimilated words;

Words are based on words, that is, words are formed and enter our language without any changes in their form and meaning. For example: bar, film, leader;

Most people know familiar words without any changes or additions: bar, movie, leader, because such words perform the function of Uzbek words, and some people on the contrary, they do not know the words that have been added, that have been changed.

For example, how many speakers know that some words come from English or French? Some adjectives are expressed in their original form or in a form that corresponds to them: for example, French bojole, vest, coat, English punch and ponce, roastbeef and rosbif (or rosbiffe) we can mention.

Most of the borrowed words are translated words. There are two main types of such words:

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They are semantically translated words. We can see in the meaning and form of the word that comes from a foreign language that it corresponds to the Uzbek language and is used. For example, comfort (household services) is expressed in English as comforts. Or the authoritarian word in Uzbek a few years ago meant "rendere autorevole," meaning "to work independently."

A group of words translated from a foreign language into Uzbek by direct translation kalka: sky-scraper in English; klassen kampf in German.

Assimilation is an important process in which words are linked. The relationship between assimilation neologisms and bilingualism is evident in the use of bilingualism by speakers, depending on the situation and place. The origin of borrowed words can be seen in the influence of vernacular or other languages, as well as in the mutual appreciation of the two languages. This is the case in German and Romance.

We can distinguish words by importance and wealth. First, when the word is accompanied by a referent (i.e., object and idea, thought), for example, the word patata gaytan is introduced into Italian through Spanish, or the word caffe is derived from Turkish, zero Arabic words such as tram, transistor, juke-box (which did not have zero in Roman numerals) came from English<sup>4</sup>.

The stylistic and social status of the acquired words plays an important role in terms of richness. It serves to remember the society, culture, living conditions: the richness of the acquired words is reflected in the words leader, flirt, baby-sitter, week- end. English words and phrases are sometimes short because they are easy to understand: in the language of journalism, they explain the words that occur in the field, for example, boom, show Italian equivalents show (type of theater, a few different bo The Italian equivalent sit-in, consisting of gins, is to gather an audience in a particular place).

#### **CONCLUSION**

We need to be able to correctly distinguish between the neologism of a real assimilation and the figurative meaning of a word that comes from a foreign language. For example, some Middle Eastern scholars used figurative meanings of words when they could remember them well but could not pronounce them.

What are neologisms? Includes nouns, verbs, and adjectives. Assimilative verbs and adjectives combine in a narrow linguistic sense, and also create a bilingual environment. It should also be noted that assimilated words are also called elements of morphology.

Modern linguistics emphasizes neologisms as the main characters in the evolution of linguistics. A new word means a rich vocabulary. The whole process of forming a new word is called neology.

Assimilation neologisms are rapidly formed and developed in areas where news and news spread rapidly. As mentioned above, assimilation neologisms are also formed from existing words, abbreviations, acronyms, and by changing the sounds of a word.

The following types of language neologisms are observed:

Variables are neologisms that have a new meaning and are used in a narrow sense by a single culture.

Common neologisms used by society but not yet linguistically accepted.
